

Sanborn County Shooting Sports Information 2021

State Shoot

The State Shoot for 4-H Shootings Sports is April 23-25 in Ft. Pierre. Events start on Friday morning and continue through Sunday noon. To qualify for the State Shoot, a 4-Her must shoot a qualifying score at a match shoot at the county level and also pass a safety test. Qualifying scores for each discipline are on page 2. Age levels (by 4-H age on January 1) are beginners 8-10, juniors 11-13, seniors 14-18. The dates for Match shoots are included with the schedule.

Once you have a qualifying match shoot score, these are submitted to state both to qualify for going to the state shoot in that discipline, and also to compete against other shooters across the state. There are placings given for each discipline at each age level for each match...1, 2 & 3. Each time a qualifying score is submitted, there is a charge of \$5 per entry. Fees should be paid to Sanborn County 4-H Shooting Sports and given to Audrey. You only have to submit one qualifying score per discipline to shoot at the state shoot.

As soon as February, we will begin to look at registration times for the state shoot. You choose when you want to shoot (subject to availability of that time slot). For example, if you qualify in BB gun and archery, you may schedule to shoot both of those on Friday night, or on Saturday, or on Sunday. Registration fee for each discipline at State Shoot is \$10.

If you want to stay overnight at the State Shoot on Friday, April 23 or Saturday, April 24, I will have a block of rooms reserved at Holiday Inn Express, Ft. Pierre.

Team Shirts

Over the past two years, we purchased team shirts that could be worn at any time, but specifically to be worn as a team at the State Shoot in Ft. Pierre. More info to come – we will be doing a new design for this year.

County Records

County records can be found on the plaques on the north wall of the 4-H Building. Scores for breaking a county shoot record may be submitted from any match shoot, as well as the state or national shoot. We will have a “leader board” displaying the current records, and update them as they are broke throughout the season. If a shooter breaks a record, which is then broke by another shooter, we will make sure the first shooter knows their record has been broke. If we get to the last match shoot of the season, and a shooter chooses to shoot more than one time in an attempt to break a record, and succeeds, the shooter who previously held the record will have the opportunity to shoot an equal number of times at this shoot.

County Shoot Placings

We will use all Match shoots at the county level to determine county shoot placings. You can choose to shoot on any or all of these days. The top scores from these 3 days will be used to determine county placings in each division and discipline. We will have a “leader board” displaying the top scores per discipline/division after each match shoot.

To clarify your options on match shoots... Generally we find that on a match shoot day, shooters shoot one time per discipline. However we have never limited this to one. We may have a shooter that does not shoot a qualifying score for state, and wants to try again. Or we may have a shooter not score as well as they would like, and want to try again for a better score. This is allowed, as long as you shoot the entire sequence again. For example, if shooting

BB gun, you would need to shoot all 4 positions again. If shooting archery, you would shoot all 6 relays. In addition, your 2nd time to shoot is allowed when there is a lane available. If a shooter has not shot their first time, they have priority on the lane before a shooter shoots a 2nd time.

BB Gun

If you are interested in becoming a more competitive shooter, you may be interested in purchasing your own BB gun at some point. This will let you have a gun that has the sights set for you and not adjusted by another shooter. The recommended BB gun is an Avanti 499. We can help you contact Daisy directly and get this gun for about \$95 + shipping. You may also want to check with alumni of the shooting sports program to purchase a BB gun, or other guns like the air pistol or air rifle.
